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US APRIL CATTLE PLACEMENTS LIKELY TO FALL 3.2% FROM YEAR EARLIER, ANALYSTS SAY - REUTERS NEWS

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FOR MAY 2024, THE PLACEMENTS WERE AT 1. 656 MILLION UP 6% FROM 2023. TO HAVE PLACEMENTS DOWN 3.2% THIS YEAR, IT IS LIKELY DUE TO HEIFERS BEING RETAINED.

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IT WAS A QUIET TRADING DAY TUESDAY. TRADERS ARE WAITING FOR THE WEEKLY CASH MARKET PRICE AND THE COF REPORT ON FRIDAY. AUGUST, THE MOST ACTIVE MONTH ONLY HAD VOLUME AT 16,851 CONTRACTS.

ONCE AGAIN, THE CUMLATIVE BOXED BEEF PRICE WENT TO HISTORIC HIGHS. CHOICE BEEF WAS UP \$3.94 AND SELECT BEEF WAS UP .85. THE QUESTION IS WHAT HAPPENS AFTER MEMORIAL DAY? WILL BEEF DEMAND REMAIN. GROUND BEEF IS THE LARGEST SELLING BEEF PRODUCT. THE SUMMER OF 2025 WILL SEE INCREASING SALES OF GROUND BEEF.

THE NEXT 2 WEEKS WILL HAVE A LIGHT SLAUGHTER FOLLOWING MEMORIAL DAY WITH PACKERS DOWN MONDAY AND THE FOLLOWING WEEK PACKERS WILL PULL UP THEIR OWN CATTLE AND CONTRACTED CATTLE.

IT IS DOUBTFUL THAT FEEDER CATTLE WILL BEGIN TO CROSS THE BORDER IN JUNE. SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE ROLLINS SAID THE QUARANTINE WILL BE LOOKED AT MONTH TO MONTH FOR PROGRESS ON ELIMINATING THE NEW WORLD SCREWWORM BUT THE FLY HAS MOVED DOWN TO PANAMA AND FLIES DO INCREASING DURING THE SUMMER WITH CONCERN THERE WILL BE FLIES MOVING INTO THE U.S. IT IS LIKELY THE QUARANTINE COULD REMAIN THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER. FORTUNATELY, BIRD MIGRATION WILL BE OVER SOON TO THE U.S. WITH LARVAE ABLE TO ATTACH TO BIRDS.

FROM APRIL  $4^{TH}$  TO APRIL  $9^{TH}$  IT DROPPED 15.92. IS THIS JUST ANOTHER SPEC DROP. CASH IS CERTAINLY HIGHER AND BEEF PRICES ARE HIGH.

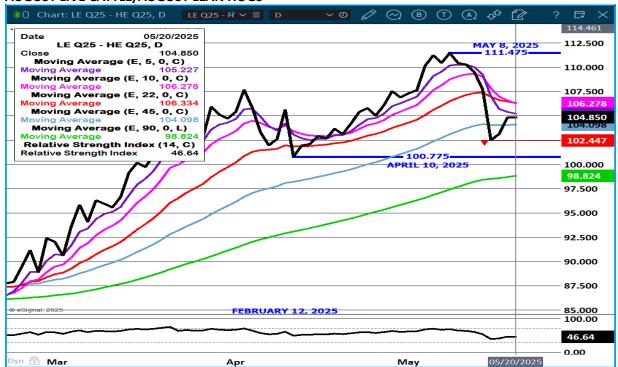

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A QUIET DAY OF TRADING ON TUESDAY. PACKERS HAVE MOST HOG SUPPLIES BOUGHT FOR THE WEEK AFTER MEMORIAL DAY.

PACKER MARGINS MOVING BACK TO A POSAITIVE AREA. DEMAND FOR PORK EXPECTED TO INCREASE SUMMER INTO END OF THE YEAR.

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PORK HAS A NEW SLOGAN, "TASTE WHAT PORK CAN DO". IT IS TO INCREASE DEMAND FOR CONSUM-FRS AND RESTAURANTS.

IN MY OPINION UNTIL THEY CAN GET THE FAST FOOD INDUSTRY TO INCREASE IT ON MENUS AS A CONSTANT ITEM, AND TO HAVE STORES LOWER THE PRICE TO BE MORE COMPETITIVE TO POULTRY AND ESPECIALLY BEEF, WE ALREADY KNOW WHAT PORK CAN DO.

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BRAZIL POULTRY IS BEING BANNED BY MANY ASIAN AND EUROPEAN COUNTRIES DUE TO BIRD FLU.
BRAZIL IS THE LARGEST EXPORTER OF POULTRY. OF COURSE IT IS LIKELY COUNTRIES WILL INCREASE

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POULTRY EXPORTS FROM THE U.S., BUT IT COULD HELP U.S. PORK EXPORTS UNLESS THE TARIFFS BE-COME TOO HIGH. PRESIDENT TRUMP LAST WEEK SAID COUNTRIES WILL SOON BE NOTIFIED OF "OF-FICIAL" TARIFFS OVER THE NEXT FEW WEEKS.
